8 Habits of Evangelism by Rev. Phil Price

As a result of two recent conversations I have been thinking more about *evangelism*, coincidentally, so too has the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

At a recent gathering of congregational leaders, to talk about Sunday morning worship, a repeated comment was the desire to see more people coming to church! And a few weeks later, after worship, someone asked me if our congregation is considered "evangelistic"? In between these two conversations I received an email that went out to Presbyterian leaders across the country, about the upcoming digital *REvangelism Conference: 8 Habits of Evangelism* which will be held on November 1st through 3rd. It may be that these three occurrences are not completely coincidental, that God is at work trying to tell us something.

Before I get to what it is I think God is telling us, let's first consider the word at the heart of all three of these happenings I just mentioned: that is, *evangelism*. In the Bible, the word *evangelism* is found in the New Testament and is derived from a Greek word "*evangelion*" meaning "good news"; that is, sharing the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ through a variety of means.

If *evangelism* is only about getting more people into our churches it is not really good news. *Evangelism* is not good news if it is only about eternal life, after we die. Neither is *evangelism* good news if it is only about one style of worship or one interpretation of the Bible or adherence to one political party in the 21st century. But when we turn to the Bible, what we find is the reminder that "evangelism" and being "evangelistic" are about sharing how fiercely God's love is at work in us through Jesus' command to be at work healing broken relationships, lives, systems and indeed, all of Creation.

The problem with *evangelism*, according to Ray G. Jones III (*Presbyterian Mission Agency's Director of Theology, Formation & Evangelism*), is that we have reduced the good news of the gospel to growing our churches and going to heaven when we die. While healthy churches and the promise of eternal life are wonderful, the good news of our salvation is much more expansive. Salvation is God's rescue plan for Creation; the transformation of lives, relationships, communities, peoples, nations, and Creation. *Evangelism* is so much more than filling the pews, offering plates, and leadership positions of our church.

It is this understanding of *evangelism* that has led me to wonder if God is telling us something. Could it be that by leading some to want to invite more to join us in life and ministry through our congregation, ask aloud about what it means to be "evangelistic", and the Presbyterian Mission Agency making it possible for many to join in discussion and training through this November's upcoming digital REvangelism conference that God in Jesus Christ hopes we too will make *evangelism* more of a part of who we are as followers of Jesus Christ and together as a congregation?

The REvangelism Conference is an opportunity to go deeper on a journey into faith: into the lives of others, into justice, hope, and the wonder of God. While not everyone will be able to participate in the November 1st through 3rd digital conference, there will be an opportunity to go further as a congregation into what *evangelism* looks like today. Beginning in September the 8:30 a.m. Adult Class time will dig into the "8 Habits of Evangelism" (with both written material and a short video) starting with a broader consideration of *evangelism*, itself. This learning time will continue through October by looking at each of the 8 Habits: Radical Welcome, Worship, Sacraments, Prayer, Justice, Teaching, Fellowship, and Generosity.

By exploring what all *evangelism* really involves we will not only address the health of our own hearts, but also that of our congregation and our wider community. Will you join me in thinking about what it means to practice the 8 Habits of *Evangelism* that will engage us in the gospel of good news – God's justice and reconciliation for the world – as we seek to follow Jesus Christ? Doing so may not fill our pews, offering plates, or the leadership positions of our congregation, but if we all had a healthier understanding of *evangelism—sharing the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ through a variety of means*—I believe we would both be healthier Christians and more true to who we are called to be as a congregation.



Sandwich Saturday Ministry

Sandwich Saturday began serving sack lunches in October. We prepared 25 lunches which included a handmade peanut butter and jelly sandwich, an apple, 2 cookies, a bag of chips and a bottle of water. Lunches are packed in an assembly line manner practicing social distancing. We set up a table on the sidewalk in front of the church and hung banners inviting any-one needing a lunch. Any left over lunches were placed in the blessing box.



When the number of Covid-19 cases increased, we began purchasing the Smucker's frozen peanut butter and jelly sandwiches.

With the weather reaching colder temperatures, we had fewer lunches picked up from the table. It was then decided to reach out in to the community and we learned that a number of families with children are living in the motels on Addison Avenue West. We now deliver 25 lunches to the Apollo Inn who in turn distributes to families in need living in that group of motels. Recently we learned that the SureStay Hotel on Blue Lakes also has a need and we have begun delivering 20 lunches to them. 65 lunches are now being prepared and distributed every other Saturday. This includes the 20 offered in front of the church.

We appreciate all the volunteers who are helping with the purchasing of groceries, setting up the assembly line, filling the lunch bags, hanging the banners, delivering the lunches, and helping with clean-up. Thank you to all of those who have helped!!! We have compiled a list of those interested in helping and emails are sent out on a rotation basis. We start filling the bags at 11:30 and are usually finished with that component by 11:45. The lunches are then delivered and others stay to help with clean-up, preparation for the next serving date, or help with the table in front of the church. We are completely finished by 1:00. Not everyone will be there the entire time. If there are others wanting to help, please contact Darlene Annen at dcannen@gmail.com or call 208-308-6681.

This ministry not only helps others but provides an opportunity for fellowship among our congregation as well.

Children' Ministry Programs Sunday School K-5

We are just beginning to offer in-person Sunday School which is meeting downstairs in the Fellowship Room. So far, we are observing the usual mask/social distancing protocols. It is great to be able to greet the K-5 children with Bible Stories and crafts.

We will continue to offer LEGOS lessons which will be mailed out each week. That way we can reach everyone!

If, at any time, you have questions or input about how we are reaching out to families, please share them with us. We entertain all possibilities about meeting your family's needs. Look for an opportunity in late May or June to get together outside with kids and parents to create ideas and get reacquainted and eat together.
