8 Habits of Evangelism – Worship

One of the most welcome surprises of the PC(U.S.A.) Mission Agency's "8 Habits of Evangelism" is its holistic perspective. That is, sharing the good news of God's love in Jesus Christ is about far more than the work of just one committee or group of people; it is the work of the church!

Bruce Reyes-Chow, discusses how worship, in nearly every church across America, has changed this past year in regards to our assumptions about on-line versus in-person worship. He does this by laying-out a few assumptions regarding in-person and online worship:

- In-person worship builds deep relationships; online worship does less than. False. While in-person worship is what we have always known, there is more than one way to develop relationship.
- Online worship is exclusive; in-person worship is inclusive. **False.** While not everyone has access to technology, not everyone is able to be in the sanctuary each and every Sunday. We need to start examining both worship experiences through the same lens.
- Online worship is the future; in-person is the past. False. In the future we will need to have a number of ways to connect with one another in order to maintain our commitment to gathering around the holy, not one or the other.

The point is that as we continue to move beyond this season of disruption, how are we going to ensure that we are communicating God's love in Jesus Christ? Just as we have had to embrace new technologies as they have become available (our 100+ year old sanctuary did not used to have either a sound-system, air conditioning, or video screens) online worship will add to our reach as we continue to seek to be living examples of God's love in the world.

The biblical rationale for worship's role in the habits of evangelism is found in 1 Corinthians 9:19-23, CEB): Although I'm free from all people, I make myself a slave to all people, to recruit more of them. I act like a Jew to the Jews, so I can recruit Jews. I act like I'm under the Law to those under the Law, so I can recruit those who are under the Law (though I myself am not under the Law). I act like I'm outside the Law to those who are outside the Law, so I can recruit those outside the Law (though I'm not outside the law of God but rather under the law of Christ). I act weak to the weak, so I can recruit the weak. I have become all things to all people, so I could save some by all possible means. All the things I do are for the sake of the gospel.

That is, the Apostle Paul anticipates that sharing the good news of God's love found in Jesus Christ, with the world, is not a one-size fits all approach. How will we expand the reach of our worship so that others experience the joy we have found in God's presence?

As we think about how our worship of God in Christ empowered by the Holy Spirit allows us to share the Gospel today and into the future some themes and questions to consider are:

- Sorrow: What have we lost and what losses have we grieved these past eighteen months?
- **Joy:** What have we gained and where have we seen new life and growth?
- **Learnings:** What have we learned about our congregation and what has been most surprising about how we have navigated this season of disruption?
- **Possibilities:** What worship practices or perspectives might God be revealing to is as we move forward?

Worship is the one part of the life and ministry of our congregation in which we all have a part to play as we come before the Audience of our time together; God our Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. So how will we make the time that we share, not only with those who find their way to downtown Twin Falls, but also impart that grace, hope, and love to the earth? Next month we'll consider how the Sacraments influence evangelism.

Minutes from September Stated Session Meeting

September 21st 2021 in the Fellowship Room

A quorum being present, the meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. with prayer. Present were the Moderator Phil Price, Mark Crothers, Terry Fletcher, Lawrence Flournoy, Linda Howar, Bob Parkinson, Judy Pollow, Chris Talkington, Susan Waters, Phil Winn, and Judy Wright. Kristin Keller was absent.

The minutes of the August meeting were not available.

Unfinished Business

Changes to the Administrative Manual – III. F. 3. d.

MSP – See 1. Holidays. Shall change "working over 20 hours per week" to "working 20 hours or more per week".

<u>MSP</u> to add to "1. Holidays" the following – "All paid staff shall be afforded the listed paid holidays. For those employees normally required to be present on scheduled days, holidays occurring on a Sunday would be re-scheduled to occur on either the previous or next regular work day with coordination and approval of the Head of Staff."

<u>MSP</u> – See 2. Vacation. Shall replace the second sentence with "Non-pastoral staff are granted paid vacation as follows without proration:".

Also pertaining to this section of the Administrative Manual is a consensus during the August Session meeting. "The Session determined that no provision be made for pay increases on the basis of tenure. Merit bonuses may be awarded on a case-by-case basis for efforts 'above the call' of the position description when such are acknowledged in the annual performance review. When adjustments to the duties and responsibilities defined in the position description are deemed appropriate, commensurate adjustment in compensation can be made for upcoming budget years. Cost-of-living adjustments have not been addressed in our Administrative Manual.

A sign-up sheet was passed for Communion Preparation/Clean-up.

New Business

<u>MSP</u> – Allow Gideons to receive a free-will offering in a separate basket at the back of the sanctuary.

<u>MSP</u> – Approve Mark Crothers making application to be a Commissioned Ruling Elder after affirmative reply to seven questions.

Will be a Stewardship Minute for Mission October 17.

Committee Reports

Building & Grounds: Is looking at Cybersecurity. Elevator inspection is beginning. Have had more plumbing problems repaired. PAI plans to construct a new building starting December 2021 and expect to move from our building after school ends June 2023. Is now discussing action to take on this news.

Worship: Expressed concern that several people attending worship did not wear a mask. Expressed concern that those worshipping then removed their masks in the Fellowship Room (because drinking and eating). Expressed concern about Passing the Peace. <u>MSP</u> to discontinue Passing the Peace until further notice.

Minutes from September Stated Session Meeting (continued)

Christian Nurture: Sunday school for children/youth resumed in-person September 12th in the multipurpose room. A TV was installed in the multipurpose room for Christian Education needs. Sunday school will be available every Sunday morning EXCEPT Communion Sunday. Intend to assemble hygiene kits October 21.

Mission: Facebook check-ins recipient for August/September is the Twin Falls Senior Center. Will have sign-up sheet for raking lawns Oct 16, 23, 30 and Nov 6. More details will follow. The Sunday School Department mission project to make 64 Hygiene Kits will be funded by our mission funds and donations. Have been helping Bickel and Lincoln Elementary Schools. In the future will also help Oregon Trail Elementary School in South Park.

Personnel: See Unfinished Business.

Stewardship: Will present a Minute for Mission October 17.

Treasurer: August financial report was available.





Sandwich Saturday Ministry

Sandwich Saturday began serving sack lunches in October 2020. We have grown from preparing 25 sack lunches to 70 sack lunches. Each lunch includes 2 Smucker's peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. an apple or an orange, 2 cookies, a bag of chips and a bottle of water. Lunches are packed in an assembly line manner. 20 lunches are placed on a table set up on the sidewalk in front of the church and banners are hung inviting anyone needing a lunch. Any left over lunches are placed in the blessing box. We have reached out to the community and learned that a number of families with children are living in the motels on Addison Avenue West. We now deliver 25 lunches to the Apollo Inn who in turn distributes to families in need living in that group of motels. We also learned that the SureStay Hotel on Blue Lakes has a need and deliver 25 lunches to them. 70 lunches are now being prepared and distributed every other Saturday. The motels and their guests often express their appreciation.

We appreciate all the volunteers who are helping with the purchasing of groceries, setting up the assembly line, filling the lunch bags, hanging the banners, delivering the lunches, and helping with clean-up. Thank you to all of those who have helped and continue to help!!! We start filling the bags at 11:00 and are usually finished with that component by 11:15. The lunches are then delivered and others stay to help with clean-up or preparation for the next serving date. We are completely finished by 1:00. Most helpers are finished by no later than 12:00.
