## Can You Ever Have Too Many New Books?!?

As we turn our calendars to 2022 one of the silver-linings is that everyone from NPR to the Wall Street Journal to Literary Hub (website) has been listing the best books of the year! Even in this year we all want to forget; there have been some truly great books released that helped us forget the headlines and dig in to truly great stories as well as compelling thoughts about the past and world we hope to one day inhabit.

From time to time I share what I am reading with others in the congregation who also enjoy some of the same tastes in reading that I do. But once a year I like to share with all of you some of what I have read in the year that was with the hope that something on my list will inspire your own enjoyment or edification. Below are three each from the areas of theology/church, non-fiction, and just-for-fun fiction:

## Theology/Church

<u>Reformed Worship</u> by Howard L. Rice and James Huffstutler; if you ever wanted a good understanding of why we worship the way we do, as Presbyterians, then this is the book. It offers a discussion of our tradition, history, theology, and rationale for how we worship.

<u>Faith after Doubt: Why Your Beliefs Stopped Working and What to Do about It</u> by Brian D. McLaren; proposes a four-stage model of faith: Simplicity, Complexity, Perplexity, and Harmony; a path forward leaving behind unnecessary baggage toward a commitment to what matters most.

Wholehearted Faith by Rachel Held Evans; through theological reflection and personal recollection, the author wrestles with God's grace and love, looks unsparingly at what the Church is and does, and explores universal human questions about becoming and belonging.

#### Non Fiction

Robert E. Lee and Me: A Southerner's Reckoning with the Myth of the Lost Cause by Ty Seidule; a unique blend of history and reflection, the author deconstructs the truth about the Confederacy—that its undisputed primary goal was the subjugation and enslavement of Black Americans—and directly challenges the idea of honoring those who labored to preserve that system and committed treason in their failed attempt to achieve it.

<u>Liftoff: Elon Musk and the Desperate Early Days that Launched SpaceX</u> by Eric Berger; take an inside the wild early days that made SpaceX. Focusing on the company's first four launches of the Falcon 1 rocket, the author charts SpaceX's bumpy journey from scrappy underdog to aerospace pioneer.

The Wax Pack: On the Open Road in Search of Baseball's Afterlife by Brad Balukjian; is there life after baseball? Starting from this simple question, *The Wax Pack* ends up with something much bigger and unexpected—a meditation on the loss of innocence and the gift of impermanence, for both the author and the former ballplayers he tracked down.

#### **Fiction**

The Invisible Life of Addie Larue by V.E. Schwab; France, 1714: in a moment of desperation, a young woman makes a Faustian bargain to live forever—and is cursed to be forgotten by everyone she meets. But everything changes when, after nearly 300 years, Addie stumbles across a young man in a hidden bookstore and he remembers her name.

<u>Project Hail Mary</u> by Andy Weir; part scientific mystery, part dazzling interstellar journey, this novel is a tale of discovery, speculation and survival from the author of "The Martian".

<u>Under the Whispering Door</u> by T.J. Klune; when a reaper comes to collect Wallace Price from his own funeral, Wallace suspects he really might be dead; a touching story about the meaning of life.

Now that you have seen what I have been reading, how about sharing one with me that you have read that you would recommend to round-out my "Top Ten Best Reads of 2021"?

The Session of First Presbyterian Church of Twin Falls held its regularly scheduled meeting on November 16<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Room.

A letter was received from the Mission Committee of the First Presbyterian Church of Pocatello. They are inviting our church to participate in a Rent Relief Program for refugees coming to our area. The Mission Committee will take this under consideration.

Shirley Thorpe was removed from the roll due to death.

The make-up of the Ad-hoc Building Use Committee was approved.

Pledge Cards will not be used for stewardship this year. An explanation for this change will be included in the Yearly Statements sent to congregation members.

The Session moved into Executive Session at 5:43 p.m. The regular meeting resumed by motion and second at 6:03 p.m.

A Minute for Mission will be given on November 21<sup>st</sup> to describe the Advent Devotional Books that have been created for the congregation's use.

The 'Fifth Sunday' activity held on October 31<sup>st</sup> was a success! Future Fifth Sunday worship services are planned for January and May, 2022.

The welcoming atmosphere of Fellowship Time following worship is appreciated by our visitors.

Work continues on rewriting church employee job descriptions to clarify duties in greater detail.

Written reports were submitted by John Howar, representing the Building and Grounds Committee; Linda Howar for the Christian Nurture Committee, and Bob Parkinson for the Mission Committee.

Members of the congregation will be asked to serve as candle lighters during Advent.

This year's Christmas Eve candlelight service will begin at 5:00 p.m. Pastor Phil will be posting a 'Blue Christmas' video on YouTube as well as creating more specific instructions for those distribute communion during worship.



## **Sandwich Saturday Ministry**

Sandwich Saturday began serving sack lunches in October 2020. We have grown from preparing 25 sack lunches to 70 sack lunches. Each lunch includes 2 Smucker's peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, an apple or an orange, 2 cookies, a bag of chips and a bottle of water. Lunches are packed in an assembly line manner. 20 lunches are placed on a table set up on the sidewalk in front of the church and banners are hung inviting anyone needing a lunch. Any left over lunches are placed in the blessing box. We have reached out to the community and learned that a number of families with children are living in the motels on Addison Avenue West. We now deliver 25 lunches to the Apollo Inn who in turn distributes to families in need living in that group of motels. We also learned that the SureStay Hotel on Blue Lakes has a need and deliver 25 lunches to them. 70 lunches are now being prepared and distributed every other Saturday. The motels and their guests often express their appreciation.

We appreciate all the volunteers who are helping with the purchasing of groceries, setting up the assembly line, filling the lunch bags, hanging the banners, delivering the lunches, and helping with clean-up. Thank you to all of those who have helped and continue to help!!! We start filling the bags at 11:00 and are usually finished with that component by 11:15. The lunches are then delivered and others stay to help with clean-up or preparation for the next serving date. We are completely finished by 1:00. Most helpers are finished by no later than 12:00.
