Who Are You Listening To? By Reverend Phil Price

Many people use the season of Lent to develop new or deepening spiritual practices which strengthen their faith. Some will give-up something in their life, like caffeine or chocolate, so that whenever they have a craving for that which they are fasting from it serves as a prompt for prayer; to enter into the presence of the Divine for assistance in maintaining their seasonal fast. Though I understand the idea behind such spiritual fasts I have struggled to maintain them, myself.

This Lent, along with working through "Brave Church", I have signed-up to participate in an online pop-up learning community. That is, a six-week virtual study group titled "Jesus de/constructed: rediscovering the freaking awesome Jesus for the first time...." That's quite a title, isn't it? The reason I'm sharing it with you is that it got me thinking about how who and what we listen to shapes who we are in relationship to God and one another. Lately, I have been listening to a number of podcasts that help shape my understanding of faith and life and I thought that sharing them with you might help your journey of faith, as well.

One of the great things about podcasts is that they are free, though you will hear numerous plugs asking for sponsorship help. And while I listen to podcasts primarily through my cellphone while cooking, working stained glass, or walking on the treadmill, so too can you look up the shows listed below however you interact with the internet.

I heard about "Jesus de/constructed" by listening to the "Homebrewed Christianity" podcast which is hosted by Dr. Tripp Fuller. He is a Postdoctoral Research Fellow in Theology & Science at the University of Edinburgh. On his semi-weekly podcast he both seriously and humorously delves into a variety of topics. The show's website says: "Our goal is to bring the wisdom of the academy's ivory tower into your earbuds. Think of each episode as an audiological ingredient for your to brew your own faith." Ranging from an hour-and-a-half to two hours or more, I have found Tripp Fuller in-depth investigations both challenging and illuminating.

Another podcast, that a number of you have heard me mention, is "The Bible for Normal People". It is a vast repository for expanding how to understand the Bible today. This blog is co-hosted by Peter Enns, who is a professor of biblical studies at Eastern University, and Jared Byas, who is a former philosophy professor. Although both men have impressive academic credentials their goal is to help "normal" people discover new and different ways of understanding and interpreting our sacred book. Their weekly podcast ranges from forty-five minutes to an hour and like "Homebrewed Christianity" there is several years' worth of episodes to explore.

A third podcast I have been listening to that has very little to do with scripture or theology, but has been a real comfort, nonetheless is titled: "In the Bubble with Andy Slavitt". Apple podcast reviews describes it: "This show is an insider's guide for getting closure on what has happened throughout the pandemic so far, how we emerge, and what must come next. Special guests include leaders we rarely get to see drop their guard the way they do on this podcast. Andy gives listeners information and inspiration from his bubble every Monday and Wednesday."

Whether you join me in furthering your faith by learning from guests on "Homebrewed Christianity" and "The Bible for Normal People" or you are looking to learn more about what is going on in the world through "In the Bible with Andy Slavitt", podcasts are a great way to learn about God and the world we have been given. As you enter the season of Lent who will you be listening to and how will what you hear shape your experience of God's presence in your life? As we make our way to the cross and beyond the empty tomb there are guides to help us experience Jesus more fully and live more faithfully into way God intends us to live.

Sandwich Saturday Ministry

Sandwich Saturday began serving sack lunches in October 2020. We have grown from preparing 25 sack lunches to 70 sack lunches. Each lunch includes 2 Smucker's peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, an apple or an orange, 2 cookies, a bag of chips and a bottle of water. Lunches are packed in an assembly line manner. 20 lunches are placed on a table set up on the sidewalk in front of the church and banners are hung inviting anyone needing a lunch. Any left over lunches are placed in the blessing box. We have reached out to the community and learned that a number of families with children are living in the motels on Addison Avenue West. We now deliver 25 lunches to the Apollo Inn who in turn distributes to families in need living in that group of motels. We also learned that the SureStay Hotel on Blue Lakes has a need and deliver 25 lunches to them. 70 lunches are now being prepared and distributed every other Saturday. The motels and their guests often express their appreciation.

We appreciate all the volunteers who are helping with the purchasing of groceries, setting up the assembly line, filling the lunch bags, hanging the banners, delivering the lunches, and helping with clean-up. Thank you to all of those who have helped and continue to help!!! We start filling the bags at 11:00 and are usually finished with that component by 11:15. The lunches are then delivered and others stay to help with clean-up or preparation for the next serving date. We are completely finished by 1:00. Most helpers are finished by no later than 12:00.

This ministry not only helps others but provides an opportunity for fellowship among our congregation as well.





The 5th Sunday in January A Great Experience of Worship and Fellowship
