225th General Assembly By Rev. Phil Price

The first part of my July is going to be spent in-person and online as Kendall Presbytery's Teaching Elder Commissioner to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s biennial denomination wide meeting. The meetings of the 225th General Assembly will be a blend between in-person Assembly committee meetings held at the Presbyterian Center in Louisville and online plenaries (to be attended by all participants at a conference or assembly, who otherwise meet in smaller groups) convened via Zoom between Friday, June 17, 2022, and Saturday, July 9, 2022. We have been told to expect up to *12 hours each day* (including breaks) in worship, plenary gatherings and other Assembly functions!

Committee assignments, where I will be from June 29th through July 2nd, were assigned at random; I will be serving on the General Assembly Ministry Coordination committee. The description for the committee's work is: "Items related to the outward facing actions of A Corp/Administrative Services Group, Presbyterian Mission Agency, and the Office of the General Assembly." I'm not quite sure what to make of that, but the one piece of business that most interests me is a recommendation for "Determining the Format for the 226th General Assembly (2024)".

In addition to the work of the Ministry Coordination committee, as a commissioner to the 225th General Assembly, there are 15 more committees deliberating on business to reject, table, or pass on for action in plenary sessions the first week of July. With that in mind, I thought you might be interested in some of the business before the assembly.

Ecumenical statements: in particular a study document on antisemitism and Islamophobia will be considered. Part of the rationale for this material states, "When Christians do not know the antisemitism and Islamophobia woven into our history, we are unable to come to our Jewish and Muslim siblings with repentance, and seek repair for this history."

Racism: a specific committee will be examining issues of race and gender justice, in particular an overture from southeastern Missouri asking the assembly to "offer an apology to African Americans for the sin of slavery and its legacy, and to adopt a litany of repentance" as well as a report from a task force examining disparities experienced by Black women and girls.

Gun violence: perhaps it is not surprising that the assembly would be asked to take positions on gun violence after so many high profile incidents of late; among those is an overture from the Synod of the Covenant (Michigan and Ohio presbyteries) directing the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for a number of gun control policies.

New confessions: three different topics are under consideration. One speaks of the need "to investigate the extent to which our own institutions and common life have benefited from the sins of racism and racialized supremacy." A second includes the question: "What does it mean to be a human in the 21st century?" And a third was written by youth ministry leaders in the Synod of the Northeast, titled: "A Confession for Such a Time as This."

International issues: concerns about human rights and justice issues around the world, expressed in overtures to the General Assembly include: humanitarian support to sub-Saharan Africa, work for human rights in the Philippines, a response to those suffering in Syria, and a call for Presbyterians to support the Korean Peace Appeal. All such overtures were due prior to Russia invading Ukraine.

Other issues to be considered by this assembly include equity for the LGBTQIA+ community both within the church and society; a proposed amendment to the PC(USA) Book of Order requiring 12 weeks of paid family medical leave for called and installed ministers of Word and Sacrament; how to address the lack of full-time ministers for our congregations of color; and a number of changes to the standing rules that regulate how the General Assembly conducts its business.

So, as you can see, there will be a lot for your sisters and brothers, both Ruling Elders and Teaching Elders to consider the first week of July. Some of those decisions will impact our life and ministry in Twin Falls. I ask that you be in prayer throughout the week, praying for commissioners to seek the mind of Christ in all that is said and done for the glory of God.

You know when you see someone sitting on the corner by the grocery store with a sign that says "anything will help" and you are torn? Your heart says help but your brain says, "Are they going to spend my money on food or **cigarettes**?" Your Mission committee has an answer to your question! FAMILY FRIENDLY GIFTCARDS. The Mission committee has purchased \$5 family friendly gift cards from Winco and Albertson's. The cards cannot be used to buy alcohol or cigarettes. So the next time you see someone on the street corner asking for help, hand them a gift card!

Sandwich Saturday Ministry

Sandwich Saturday began serving sack lunches in October 2020. We have grown from preparing 25 sack lunches to 108 sack lunches. Each lunch includes 2 Smucker's



peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, an apple or an orange, 2 cookies, a bag of chips and a bottle of water. Lunches are packed in an assembly line manner. 20 lunches are placed on a table set up on the sidewalk in front of the church and banners are hung inviting anyone needing a lunch. Any left over lunches are placed in the blessing box. We have reached out to the community and learned that a number of families with children are living in the motels on Addison Avenue West. We now deliver 26 lunches to the Apollo Inn who in turn distributes to families in need living in that group of motels, as well as 18 lunches to Main Street Extended Stay, and 18 lunches to Old Towne Lodge. We also learned that the SureStay Hotel on Blue Lakes has a need and deliver 26 lunches to them. 108 lunches are now being prepared and distributed every other Saturday. The motels and their guests often express their appreciation.


We appreciate all the volunteers who are helping with the purchasing of groceries, setting up the assembly line, filling the lunch bags, hanging the banners, delivering the lunches, and helping with clean-up. Thank you to all of those who have helped and continue to help!!! We start filling the bags at 10:30 and are usually finished with that component by 11:15. The lunches are then delivered and others stay to help with clean-up or preparation for the next serving date. We are completely finished by 1:00. Most helpers are finished by no later than 12:00.






Folks associated with our congregation have led amazing lives and a few of them have put their memories to print! Did you know that there are authors in our midst? Towards the end of June one of the children of the church called to say that his father, Emery Petersen, has a book available for download on Amazon.com titled "Seeing the World by Motor Home." Perhaps Emery was inspired by his mother, Christina, who wrote her own book titled "Opportunities at Your Fingertips" which is also available on Amazon.com.

That phone call prompted Pastor Phil to remember a number of other family and friends of the congregation are themselves published as well. At least two of our former pastors Rev. Mike Bullard published a biography about Louise Shadduck titled "The Lioness of Idaho" and Rev. Earl Johnson, Jr., years after leaving Twin Falls, wrote "Selected to Serve: A Guide for Church Leaders" still a popular handbook for Presbyterian church leaders.

More recently, Rev.
