



I read a story about Nantucket, Massachusetts. Nantucket is a summer destination for thousands of tourists and a large number of visitors are people who walk the beaches, streets and shops in bare feet. Bare feet, with sand and other particles from outside make an awful mess on the floors of the local merchants. To prevent such a mess, stores began placing signs near the door that read: "No admission to people with bare feet".

In Nantucket, another store placed an enormous sign in the front that read "Bare feet welcome!" That store sold sandals. While others were seeing a problem, the owner of the sandal store saw need and opportunity. He was the only merchant in town who welcomed the unwelcomed and business was good.

A church parking lot had a chain draped across the entrance. In the middle of the draped chain was a sign that read "No Trespassing". That caused me to wonder about the messages we, the church, give to others. Do people read between the lines and hear us say; "some people not welcome"? Do we give messages that say; "you are welcome here if you fit into who we are". How about a message that says; "no sinners allowed". The Church becomes strong and relevant when we identify such messages and make a point of getting rid of them. If Jesus gave those messages, there would never have been a following of him or a Church to be built. If we would delete all the Gospel messages of Jesus welcoming the strangers/foreigners, thieves, poor, beggars and everyone who was identified as "unclean" and unworthy, then we would have very little new and valuable, just the same old ways and standards and Jesus of Nazareth would not likely be even a footnote in history. Jesus' entire ministry was focused upon getting rid of such messages and replacing them with signs, words and actions that announce; "EVERYONE is WELCOME" and if anyone of us is uncomfortable with that, then it is we who have some changing to do.

The sandal shop owner was the only merchant in town that saw opportunity with the unwelcome signs in other places. If the Church is going to live up to the hopes and expectations of Jesus, then it needs to discard the sensibilities of any community standard that gives any obvious or subtle unwelcome messages. The Church has the opportunity to announce the most powerful message ever given and it is; "HERE, EVERYONE IS WELCOME AND WE MEAN IT!" Because God loves everything God makes, we have been given the opportunity to be the living, visible expression of Jesus' living and teaching. He meant it when he practiced love for

Sandwich Saturday began serving sack lunches in October 2020. We have grown from preparing 25 sack lunches to 108 sack lunches. Each lunch in-



cludes 2 Smucker's peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, an apple or an orange, 2 cookies, a bag of chips and a bottle of water. Lunches are packed in an assembly line manner. 20 lunches are placed on a table set up on the sidewalk in front of the church and banners are hung inviting anyone needing a lunch. Any left over lunches are placed in the blessing box. We have reached out to the community and learned that a number of families with children are living in the motels on Addison Avenue West. We now deliver 26 lunches to the Apollo Inn who in turn distributes to families in need living in that group of motels, as well as 18 lunches to Main Street Extended Stay, and 18 lunches to Old Towne Lodge. We also learned that the SureStay Hotel on Blue Lakes has a need and deliver 26 lunches to them. 108 lunches are now being prepared and distributed every other Saturday. The motels and their guests often express their appreciation.

We appreciate all the volunteers who are helping with the purchasing of groceries, setting up the assembly line, filling the lunch bags, hanging the banners, delivering the lunches, and helping with clean-up. Thank you to all of those who have helped and continue to help!!! We start filling the bags at 10:30 and are usually finished with that component by 11:15. The lunches are then delivered and others stay to help with clean-up or preparation for the next serving date. We are completely finished by 1:00. Most helpers are finished by no later than 12:00.
