from the pastor

When I was a child and heard "old people" talking, their speech was filled with words and sentences difficult for me to understand. My grandmother spoke in such a way. Those "old folks" did not speak as we kids spoke or our parents or other kid's parents spoke. In my young mind I wondered, will I need to learn how to speak English differently when I become old? Eventually I figured it out. The "old folks" of our community were immigrants from Italy, Germany, Poland, Ukraine, Russia etc. and unlike me, their first language was not English, so they spoke English with an accent from their first language.

As a boy, I attended Sunday school and listened to other "old people" speak about things that were equally unusual to understand. They told stories of people from long ago. They were ancient people who did strange and bazaar things like turning into salt pillars for looking the wrong way, selling a younger brother into slavery (even though I would have done the same with my brother at that time) and some fringe guy named John who ate locust (grasshoppers) for lunch. All of that was odd and difficult to understand, I wondered; will I need to speak and behave oddly when I become old?"

Those "old people", Sunday school teachers, also told stories about other people from long ago. I liked the stories of Jesus loving little children, his care for the poor, the ill and the neglected as well as his love for fortunate people. I heard that accent and because of it,



I had my first sense of how I wanted to speak when I became "old". I wanted my primary language to have accents of "love". I suppose the "old folks" teaching those stories in my Sunday school did breakthrough to me.

We all speak with "accents", the option we are given as Christians is to choose what accent we will use? Jesus' accent was strong with love. Is "love" your accent? How will you speak when you are "old?



PREAMBLE TO THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

Why do we fold an American Flag is in the shape of a triangle?

Reason behind the triangular shape is so it replicates the iconic "tri-cornered" hat soldiers wore in the Continental Army during the American Revolutionary War.

DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE HISTORY



- **July 4, 1776** Commemorates the adoption of the Declaration of Independence by delegates from the 13 colonies. This is the day we celebrate the birth of the United States of America. Here is the journey the document went through.
- **April 19, 1775** Start of the American Revolution. First shots were fired between colonists and British troops during the Battles of Lexington and Concord. After these first military conflicts, tension between Britain and her American colonists continued to mount.
- July 2, 1776 The 2nd Continental Congress voted for independence from Britain.
- **July 4, 1776** Congress approved the final draft of the Declaration of Independence, drafted by Thomas Jefferson and edited by John Adams and Benjamin Franklin.
- **July 8, 1776** First public reading of the Declaration of Independence took place at the Pennsylvania State house (now Independence Hall) in Philadelphia. Later that same day other readings occurred in Trenton, New Jersey and Easton Pennsylvania.
- *Did you know? Printer John Dunlap made about 200 copies of the Declaration with the date of July 4, known as the "Dunlap Broadsides" these were distributed throughout the 13 colonies.
- **August 2, 1776** Declaration of Independence as officially signed. John Hancock, President of the Congress was the first of 56 delegates who signed a enlarged version of the document.
- **August 4, 1776** After all delegates of the Continental Congress signed the document, the Declaration of Independence was made official.
