During the meeting the farmer's son arrived at the church. He began unloading sacks of wheat from his farm wagon. He put the sacks at the door of the church and said to the others. "This is my father's witness".

Perhaps it is John 21:17 that identifies the most important witness we can make. "Do you love me?" Jesus asks Peter. Then "feed my sheep". May our witness be for that which God cares most about and it isn't limited to Christians. God's care and love is for all people. I am certain God is watching and hoping we Christians will "witness" in a way as was done by the wealthy farmer – to feed God's people. So, what are you "witnessing" for Christmas?



WHY BLUE DECORATIONS?

Blue symbolizes royalty...a coming King. It is also the color of the sky just before dawn. Many Christian churches now use blue to speak of the Kingship of Christ when the occasion is joyful. At Advent we wait with anticipation and celebration for our coming Christ. Blue perfectly reflects our anticipation as we wait with hope and expectation. Colors, paraments or coverings, and banners are some of the most important visual ways Christians have used to express their faith in worship. The objective in covering the Communion Table with cloths of various colors is to help focus the attention of worshipers on the special nature of Christ as the Perfect Sacrifice.

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit.

Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.'

Advent - For unto us a child is born...

Advent serves as a time of preparation and anticipation leading up to Christmas. This observance acknowledges the dual nature of Christ's first coming and his anticipated return, with its primary focus on spiritual reflection and renewal.

December 3rd - First Sunday of Advent Week 1: Hope (or promise)

Isaiah 9:2, 6-7

"The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness, a light has dawned...For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this."

December 10th - Second Sunday of Advent Week 2: Preparation (or waiting or prophecy) Isaiah 40:3-5

"A voice of one calling: 'In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

December 17th - Third Sunday of Advent Week 3: Joy (or peace)

Matthew 2:10-11

"When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh."

December 24th - Fourth Sunday of Advent Week 4: Love (or adoration)

John 3:16-19

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because they have not believed in the name of God's one and only Son. This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil."
